The standard PACI lesson assessment forms shall be used as the basis of all assessments.

Completed lesson assessment forms must meet the following criteria:

- be legible
- all fields completed
- must have margin notes which are written while observing student performance
- must reach an assessment decision which is recorded on the form
- assessment decisions must be reached in isolation to the senior assessor
- must be written in permanent ink
- must be kept on file – a PACI member file will be created for all assessment instruments

Training Plan:

IT courses are run in conjunction with regular scheduled PACI instructor courses.

1. Be present for all phases of a regular scheduled PACI instructor training program
2. Present demonstration lessons to instructor candidates
3. Assess candidate performance through use of the PACI lesson assessment forms
4. Compare results against those of the senior course instructor – equivalency is required
 - 3 equivalent assessment decisions for theory lessons
 - 3 equivalent assessment decisions for ground lessons
 - 3 equivalent assessment decisions for height lessons
5. Debrief and counsel instructor candidate performance.
6. Perform skills at least to a level of PACI score 4 (exceeding baseline competency criteria)
7. Ensure that students can in fact perform skills to the standard expected by industry.

ASSESSMENT:

- Conducted by a PACI instructor assessor
- Shadow assess during a scheduled instructor assessment
- Assessment decisions are made in isolation to the PACI Instructor Assessor (IA)
- Reach identical decisions in conjunction with the IA
- National assessment principles require accuracy and reliability (eg consistency) – to achieve this requirement, three (3) assessment decisions are required to match those of the IA in terms of:
 - 1) Decision outcome (ie C or NYC); and
 - 2) Underpinning reasoning must be based on measurable criteria and be in agreeance with the IA
- Decisions are always made in isolation – and then compared to the IA at the conclusion of a candidate presentation

Note to assessor: Indicate competency by writing C or NYC in each box.
